


Art and Music Learning Update


Mrs. Rhoderick (ne'e Riggs) here! I am so pleased to be able to remain at PBCCS as the Art/Music teacher. During our classes this week the students have been focusing on the abstract line and color blocking art of Piet Mondrian. Each grade band also worked on the following art skills:

- The **Kindergarteners and 1st graders** worked on using lines to create owls. We discussed what lines are and how to make shapes using lines.



- The **2nd and 3rd graders** have been working on using lines to create one line artwork. They loved the challenge of not picking up their pencils while drawing!

- The **4th and 5th graders** have been working on using lines to create patterns. They played a dice game to create mixed patterns!

Place Based Learning Update

For the 2018-2019 school year, the place based curriculum will be centered around the Land theme. This fall the students will investigate how and why people came to central Oregon, the forces that shaped our landscape and how the land in our region has changed over time.

Field Studies: Elementary school will visit Cove Palisades State Park (grades 3-5) in late October the High Desert Museum (K-5) in November. Exact dates will be shared via the classroom teacher and in this newsletter next month. Middle School field study dates are on the calendar! We'll visit new sites to learn geology and the history of the region but will also continue our yearlong field studies at both Willow Creek and McKay Creek.

- October 15 at Willow Creek
- October 18 at McKay Creek
