Reopening Requirements

These requirements form the foundation of the PBCCS reopening plan . . .

[Community COVID-19 Metrics](#) will be used to determine when students are able to return for in-person classes.

- Currently, Crook County and the state *does meet* the requirements to have our 4th - 8th grade students in the classroom for in-person instruction at PBCCS. Students in these grades will begin the year in Comprehensive Distance Learning.
- PBCCS has the potential to have K-3 students on campus for in-person learning, if the number of COVID-19 cases stay low within Crook County.
- PBCCS will continue to monitor the data closely with our partners at the Crook County Health Department through August and into September.



In-Person Learning

- *Physical distancing*
- *Stable cohorts* with their peers
- *Arrival and departure* procedures
- Frequent *cleaning and disinfecting*
- *Hand hygiene* and *personal health*
- Daily *wellness check* for students & staff. Students or staff showing symptoms of COVID-19 will be *isolated* until they are able to go home
- Students and staff exhibiting *symptoms of COVID-19 must stay home*
- *Face coverings* for students & staff

*Even with these new systems and procedures in place PBCCS staff is committed to making sure we have a **positive, welcoming, fun and interactive** learning environments.*



Comprehensive Distance Learning

- Students will participate in daily instruction from teachers, with activities planned to ensure students build and maintain connections to their classmates and staff.
- PBCCS will implement a rigorous and systematic curriculum and interactive content.
- Families will have a predictable schedule and routine focused on core content instruction and learning activities.
- Teachers will assign application activities to be completed by students independently or with adult support.
- Comprehensive Distance Learning will be scheduled to meet daily attendance requirements and students will receive feedback and be graded on their mastery of the content.
- Opportunities will be scheduled for students to receive one-on-one and/or small group support with PBCCS staff.
- Technology will be equipped with Google Classroom learning management system and tools for daily coursework and communication.
- For students on IEPs or 504 plans, PBCCS will make any necessary accommodations to curriculum and delivery to support each individual student's needs.

It is important to note Comprehensive Distance Learning will look different than it did in the Spring.



Providing a well-rounded K-8 experience

Integrate enrichment, specials and place-based activities as allowable in stable cohorts.

Ensure social emotional supports are in place and students' needs are met.



Opportunities for student recognition, community building and positive peer interaction.

Connect families to community resources and services.

Timeline



- August 11 - ODE releases updated guidelines for schools
- August 17 - School Reopening Plans are due to ODE
- August 24 - Review local & state COVID-19 data
- September 8 - School starts
- September 14 - Review local & state COVID-19 data
- October 5 - Tentatively begin in-person learning (*dependent on state and local COVID-19 metrics*)
