






CLASS SIZE


Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.


ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.




MATHEMATICS

School Goals

Powell Butte Community Charter School (PBCCS) is committed to enhancing student learning by utilizing a "Place-Base" learning model, exposing our students to in-depth learning about the history and issues that impact their community. Community partners work with PBCCS staff to provide expertise and service learning opportunities. PBCCS is committed to developing students that think critically, communicate effectively and excel academically.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2027. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Our goal at PBCCS is to ensure that all students feel safe and are connected to staff and their peers. With a small enrollment, we strive to make sure our students are thriving in all aspects of their education. Students are supported by our teachers, school counselor, administrators and support staff.
